



## CensusAtSchool 2013

**Chart 1 - Online activities in the last seven days**



### 98% of students now online on a weekly basis

CensusAtSchool is a non-profit making project funded by organisations interested in promoting good use of statistics, mathematics and data handling. Ireland became involved in CensusAtSchool in 2009 when the Professional Development Service for Teachers (PDST), the CSO, Project Maths and the National Council for Curriculum and Assessment (NCCA) collaborated to set-up the Irish website [www.censusatschool.ie](http://www.censusatschool.ie).

8,610 secondary school students from 243 schools completed the Phase 12 questionnaire of the CensusAtSchool survey between August 2012 and August 2013. The questionnaire covered a variety of topics ranging from how students travelled to school to how much they use the internet and what types of musical instruments they play. #### Interesting findings from Phase 12 results:

- Nearly two-thirds of students (61%) were in touch with friends over the internet during the week prior to answering the survey. Just 2% of students stated they had not been online during the same time period (*see Chart 1*).
- 45% of students indicated they play a musical instrument. The most popular instruments were the Piano (30%), Guitar (25%) and the Tin Whistle (13%) (*see Chart 2*).
- Over two-thirds of students (67%) have a game console at home (*see Chart 3*).
- Spanish (41%), Italian (16%) and Chinese(11%) were the languages stated by students as being the most preferred to learn when given a choice of any languages that were not currently available in their schools (*see Chart 5*).
- The most common method of travelling to school by students was by Car (47%). Travelling by Bus (27%) and Walking (21%) were the next most popular methods of travelling to school (*see Chart 6*).
- 44% of students take less than 10 minutes to travel to school. In contrast 3% of students take over 60 minutes to travel to their school (*see Chart 7*).
- Male and female students both selected Football, Boxing and Athletics as the top three sports in which they would most like to represent Ireland at the Olympics from a list of 28 options (*see Chart 10*).



## **What is the main musical instrument you play?**

Overall 45% of students stated they play a musical instrument. Chart 2 highlights the ten most popular instruments listed by the respondents.


**Chart 2 - The 10 most popular musical instruments**

The most popular device selected from the listed items was a Games console (67%). Just 0.5% of respondents stated they had none of the devices listed in Chart 3.


**Chart 3 - Electronic devices or computer related software**

40% of students stated they could hold an everyday conversation in three languages. Just 1% stated they could hold a conversation in five or more languages.


**Chart 4 - Number of languages students can hold an everyday conversation in**



## Is there a language you would like to learn that is not currently available in your school?



A breakdown by gender of the students indicated females (44%) favour Spanish more than male students (35%) while males (9%) favoured studying Japanese more than females (4%).

## How long does it take and what method do you use to travel to school?


Nearly half of students (47%) normally travel to school by car. The highest percentage of car travel to school takes place in Waterford (69%) and Sligo (65%). Students in Fingal (29%) and Leitrim (35%) relied least on car travel.



## How long is it since your last haircut?


Almost half of the students (43%) stated they had their last haircut less than four weeks ago. 59% of male students had a haircut in the four weeks prior to participating in the survey while a smaller percentage of females (29%) stated they had a haircut over the same time period.

Almost one-third of female students (30%) indicated they paid €20 to €30 for a haircut while just 2% of male students indicated this to be the price they paid. The majority of male students (59%) indicated they paid less than €10 euros for their haircut.


**Chart 9- The price of haircuts**

The project, originally a one-off, was linked to the UK population census of 2001. It has now developed into a dynamic, on-going and exciting initiative running in a number of countries.


### Sample

8,610 secondary school attendees from 243 schools completed the Phase12 questionnaire of the CensusAtSchool survey between August 2012 and August 2013. Because the survey is voluntary and not part of a representative sampling process, the results of the survey are less reliable in providing inferences about the overall secondary school student population.
